In this segment we are going to think about what a pharaoh was, and how they related to gods.

You will need to go to page 26 of the book.

Part 1

The rulers of the Ancient Egyptians were kings. After a few centuries, the word king, was replaced by the word pharaoh.

Read page 26 and write down what the word pharaoh originally meant.

Ancient Egypt was a long thin country either side of the Nile. In fact, for centuries it was two countries, which came to be known as Upper and Lower Egypt, ruled by separate kings. Draw the right hand head of picture 1 that shows the pharaoh of the combined kingdom. Write on your drawing which part was a symbol of Upper Egypt and which was the symbol of Lower Egypt.

The most famous pharaoh to many people was Tutankhamun. The video on the bottom left of page 27 is about Tutankhamun and his father . Watch the video and then write a summary of the story of Tutankhamun. Make sure you explain why he changed his name.

Pharaohs were thought of as half human, half god. They sometimes had giant statues made of themselves. The pharaoh who had the most statues made was Ramesses II. But he was famous for other things, too. Watch the video bottom right on page 27, and write down three things Ramesses was proud of.
