Dear Brutus...The amphitheatre was enormous. We had seats high up near the walls. The crowds roared every time their favourite gladiators came into the arena. They cheered even more when someone scored a victory. At the end we all left quickly down steep stone steps called vomitaria, which means to be sick. Funny name, but they were so steep we nearly fell down them.
