People learned how to how farm and grind cereals to make bread. / Neolithic

What else changed during the Neolithic period?

Answer.....

People began fishing / people went hungry when crops failed / cattle, sheep, goats and dogs were domesticated / ploughing was introduced / people began to weave / forests began to be burnt down for land / there was water pollution and more disease.

Make a drawing of what a small village might have looked like at the end of

the Neolithic period.

Answer...... Students' own answers.

Part 2 Go to pages 34-39. Why were the first houses in Orkney made from stone?

Answer.....

Because wood was not easily available.

Why was the village at Skara Brae dug partly into the ground? Describe the houses.

Answer.....

The soil was used as insulation.

Stone walls, with a conical roof, a large square room with a hearth and stone or wood furniture, soakaway toilets and drainage channels.

Draw a picture showing what an Orkney stone house may have looked like.

Answer...... Students own work.
