
ALEXANDER HAMILION



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Alexander Hamilton was born in the West Indies in 1755, and moved to America in 1772 to further his education. It was not long before Hamilton was writing about politics and revolution. During the Revolutionary War, Hamilton became a captain in the army, and worked closely with George Washington.

Hamilton was a Federalist in favor of a strong central government and maintaining good trade relations with Britain. This put him against figures like Thomas Jefferson and James Madison, who wanted little to do with Britain.

After the war, Hamilton was a lawyer and banker in New York for a time, but he soon became unhappy with the way the new country was being run. So Hamilton pushed for a convention to change the constitution, and he wrote his arguments down in 'The Federalist Papers'.

As President, George Washington made Hamilton the first Secretary of the Treasury in the United States. Hamilton created America's first government-owned bank, and he encouraged trade with Britain. He later helped establish the Federalist Party.

When it came to electing the next president, Thomas Jefferson and Aaron Burr tied. Hamilton backed Jefferson, despite their earlier differences. When Burr then ran for Governor of New York in 1802, Hamilton tried to block him again. In the end, Burr grew so frustrated at Hamilton's actions, that he challenged him to a duel in 1804. Both men fired shots in the duel. But Hamilton missed Burr, while Burr badly wounded Hamilton. Hamilton died the next day, in New York.
