
BENJAMIN HARRISON



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Benjamin Harrison (August 20, 1833 – March 13, 1901) was the grandson of the ninth President, William Henry Harrison. He was born in Ohio.

Harrison was a lawyer in Indiana and served the Union in the Civil War. He was elected to the Senate for Indiana. Harrison was a Republican. He was strongly in favour of protection barriers (tariffs) which Grover Cleveland had been against. That is how he defeated Grover Cleveland.

When elected he soon set about raising high trade barriers against the outside world. In other matters he began to establish National Forests and was keen on education being funded by the federal government as well as improving African-Americans' voting rights, but he made limited progress.

In 1890, the Battle of Wounded Knee took place, in which federal troops fought against the Sioux Native Americans, leaving 150 Sioux people dead.

While Harrison was president, the United States gained several states, including Montana, Washington, Idaho, Wyoming, and North and South Dakota. He also pushed for the annexation of Hawaii.

But then the tide turned and high barriers to trade became unpopular, so he lost the next election and Grover Cleveland returned. Later on, Harrison taught at Stanford University in San Francisco, California. In 1901, Harrison died of pneumonia in Indianapolis, Indiana.
