



CALVIN COOLIDGE

John Calvin Coolidge, Jr. (July 4, 1872 – January 5, 1933) was born in Vermont and became a Massachusetts lawyer. He joined the Republican Party and became Governor of Massachusetts.

In 1914, Coolidge made a speech known as "Have faith in Massachusetts", which showed he was in support of small-town government and less influence by the federal government. Coolidge had this speech and others published, which meant people became familiar with his ideas.

A Boston Police Strike of 1919 brought national attention, and when he put it down he was seen as a man who could make decisions and get things done.

Coolidge was first vice president, and then he succeeded to the Presidency when Warren Harding died in 1923. He then got elected in 1924. His main task, after the Harding era, was to restore public confidence in the White House.

His policies were against too much involvement overseas, and in favour of civil rights. In his first year in office, Coolidge put through the Indian Citizenship Act, which made Native Americans citizens and allowed them to keep their tribal lands. By the time his term was over, he was nationally popular, but he did not wish to run for a second term as president.
