
DOC HOLLIDAY



DOC HOLLIDAY

John Henry 'Doc' Holliday was born August 14, 1851, in Griffin, Georgia. Holliday did well at school, and went on to study dentistry in Philadelphia. He graduated in 1872, and then moved back to Georgia to set up a dental practice in Atlanta. It was his dental work that meant he got the nickname 'Doc'. In 1873, Holliday caught tuberculosis, and he moved to Dallas, Texas to improve his health by being in warmer weather.

Holliday worked as a dentist in Dallas, but he was also drawn into drinking, fighting, and playing cards in the evenings. At one point, he was charged with murder, but he escaped and then moved around within Texas, as well as through Colorado, Wyoming, and South Dakota. Eventually Holliday came to Dodge City, Kansas. There he saved lawenforcer Wyatt Earp from cowboys, and the two men became friends.

Years later, Earp and his brothers moved to Tombstone, Arizona, which was a mining town near Mexico. Holliday joined them in 1880. Here, the legendary gunfight at the O.K. Corral took place on October 26, 1881.

Virgil Earp was the police chief for Tombstone at the time. He had heard that cowboys were coming into town, and he expected trouble. So he made Holliday his deputy and took Wyatt and Morgan Earp with them to confront the trouble-makers. The shootout was short, but it cost three men their lives. Holliday and others were wounded in the fight. Holliday and Wyatt Earp were arrested for murder, but not charged or brought to trial.

Soon after the fight, Wyatt Earp's brother, Morgan, was killed. Wyatt set off to hunt down the killer, and Holliday followed him for many months. During this time Wyatt and Holliday took part in many shoot-outs. In the end, Wyatt Earp and Holliday came across two armed men, Frank Stilwell and Ike Clanton, ready to ambush Virgil Earp. The next day, Frank Stilwell was found dead.

Wyatt Earp and Holliday went on the run, and ended up in Colorado. Holliday was arrested, but then released, in Denver. He eventually lived in Glenwood Springs, Colorado, where he died from tuberculosis on November 8, 1887, in the Glenwood Springs hotel.
