

GEORGE CUSTER

George Armstrong Custer was born in New Rumley, Ohio, on December 5, 1839, although he spent much of his childhood in Michigan. He trained at the military academy at West Point in New York, although he did not stand out while he was there.

But when the Civil War broke out in 1861, Custer got a chance to prove himself. He became a cavalry commander for the Union side, and faced his first major military action at the Battle of Bull Run. He led his men to victory, and was held up as a great commander afterwards.

During the war, Custer took part in several battles, including at Gettysburg in Pennsylvania. Towards the end of the war, Custer played a crucial role in forcing the Confederate General Robert E. Lee to surrender at Appomattox in 1865.

After the Civil War, Custer's military skills were needed against the Native Americans in the Dakota Territory and the Great Plains. As settlers headed for the American West, the Native Americans who had always lived on the land there fought to defend it. The U.S army was needed to control the Native Americans to go ahead with settling the land to the west.

In 1876, Custer led a force of men against the Lakota Sioux Native Americans in Montana. There were two other forces involved, but they were delayed in reaching Custer. The Native Americans, led by Sitting Bull, were a thousand strong, whereas Custer had around 200 men. But Custer decided to attack anyway. Without reinforcements, Custer was pushed back to the Little Bighorn, where the Native Americans were able to overwhelm Custer's forces. Custer and all his men were killed. The battle is often remembered as 'Custer's Last Stand'.
