

GROVER CLEVELAND

Stephen Grover Cleveland (March 18, 1837 – June 24, 1908) was the only president to serve two terms and to be counted twice in the numbering of the presidents. That was because he did not serve two consecutive terms of office.

Cleveland was born in New Jersey and first became governor of New York. Cleveland was an anti-corruption, pro-business Democrat who was very conservative and did not believe in the subsidies and barriers to trade that had been introduced during the Civil War.

During Cleveland's first term, the Statue of Liberty was finished and dedicated. Geronimo also surrendered during this time, which put an end to the Apache wars.

In between Cleveland's terms, President Harrison aimed to overthrow the royal family in Hawaii and claim the territory. Cleveland did not support this move, but Hawaii was annexed to the United States.

During his second term, there was a depression called the Panic of 1893. It was blamed on the Democratic Party and allowed the Republicans to win the next presidential election.

Grover Cleveland was noted for being a much more 'typical' man of the people, and was noted for honesty, courage, firmness, independence, and common sense.
