

H. P. LOVECRAFT

Howard Phillips Lovecraft was born in Providence, Rhode Island, on August 20, 1890. He was only three years old when his father became mentally ill, and had to go into hospital, where he died 5 years later. It was Lovecraft's grandfather who inspired his interest in poems and stories, including horror stories.

H. P. Lovecraft was ill himself as a child, and spent much of his time at home. He loved reading, and the writer Edgar Allan Poe influenced his later works. Lovecraft was also interested in astronomy, although he never received enough education to have a career in it. As a teenager, Lovecraft had a nervous breakdown, meaning he spent even more time at home.

For a time, Lovecraft slept during the day, and was active at night, reading and occasionally writing. For much of his life, Lovecraft did not enjoy leaving his home, although he wrote tens of thousands of letters to people during his lifetime. He first worked as a journalist, and then published his own magazine called 'The Conservative' in 1915.

But before long, Lovecraft was concentrating more on fiction, particularly horror stories. In 1923, some of his tales were published in the magazine Weird Tales for the first time. The magazine specialized in horror stories, and it published some of Lovecraft's best-known stories, like 'The Call of Cthulhu'.

Many of Lovecraft's tales were about people affected by mysterious supernatural forces that they cannot control, and his works have influenced horror writing since. When money was short, Lovecraft also took to writing pieces on behalf of other people, including the famous showman Harry Houdini. Lovecraft died from cancer in 1937.
