
JOHN C. FREMONT



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John C. Frémont was born in Savannah, Georgia, on January 21, 1813, but he moved to South Carolina as a child after his father died. Frémont became a surveyor, and he mapped the Mississippi and Missouri Rivers, and then later the land between the Mississippi River valley and the Pacific Ocean.

By this point, many people were migrating west to settle the land in the Oregon area, and Frémont was sent to survey the area and plot the route west in Wyoming. He later went on expeditions to Colorado and New Mexico to look for potential railroad routes.

Frémont also explored the Sierra Nevada area on the border between Nevada and California, much of which was controlled by the Mexicans at the time. When Frémont published a report of his experiences, it made his name. He became known as the 'Great Pathfinder'.

After the Mexican-American War broke out, Frémont became involved in taking control of California. But he fell out with General Stephen W. Kearny, who was trying to form a government there. Kearny tried to have Frémont dismissed from the army, but in the end Frémont resigned anyway.

Frémont had bought land in the Sierra Nevada mountains, and he returned there during the Gold Rush. Gold was found on Frémont's land, and he became rich. He also became one of the first two senators of California when it became a state in 1850.

Then Frémont went to explore Utah Territory in 1853, which made him even more famous. He was also popular because of his involvement in the Free Soil movement in Kansas. He was then nominated for presidency as an anti-slavery candidate for the Republican Party, but he lost out to James Buchanan.

During the Civil War, Frémont played a role in Ulysses S. Grant's capture of Paducah, Kentucky, which led to Kentucky staying in the Union. President Lincoln made Frémont a Union major general in Missouri. Frémont set about taking away the property of anybody who rebelled against his side. But Lincoln thought this would turn the whole state against their cause, so Frémont lost his command.

After that, Frémont was stationed in Virginia. In 1862, he fought against General 'Stonewall' Jackson at the Battle of Cross Keys, but failed to defeat him. He was also in command of Mountain Departments in Tennessee and Kentucky during the Civil War.

Later on, Frémont promoted new railroads, but they went bankrupt and Frémont lost nearly all of his money. Frémont was appointed governor of the Arizona Territory in 1878. He retired to New York City, and died in 1890.
