

RUTHERFORD B. HAYES

Rutherford Birchard Hayes (October 4, 1822 – January 17, 1893) began his career as an attorney in Ohio. He joined the Union Army as an officer in the Civil War, earned a reputation for bravery and became a major general. He then joined the U.S. Congress and later became Governor of Ohio.

He then ran for president. However, there was chaos at the election and it was by no means certain that Hayes actually won. A deal was struck, but that made matters worse. In the long run this deal meant that Democrats could do much what they wanted in the south, including making it almost impossible for blacks to vote.

In fact, Hayes believed in equal treatment for all, including Western Indians, although again, what happened was not to turn out that way, and Indians lost even more of their lands.

> Hayes also pushed for people getting jobs in government based on skill rather than loyalty and political connections, but he was met with resistance from his political opponents.

In 1877, railroad workers went on strike because of a pay cut. They left work, and riots broke out, which Hayes had to stop by sending in federal troops.

Hayes always said he would not run for re-election, and he retired to Ohio.
