

THEODORE ROOSEVELT

Theodore "T.R." Roosevelt, Jr. (October 27, 1858 – January 6, 1919) was a leader of the Republican Party and founder of the Progressive Party. He is remembered for a wide range of interests, not just politics, but history, nature and sport. He is often thought of as having a "cowboy" personality.

Roosevelt was born to a wealthy family in New York. However, he was often ill as a child and suffered from asthma. To try to overcome this he went in for great fitness and sportsmanship, and then developed a love of nature. He studied biology at Harvard.

In the 1890s he became New York City Police Commissioner, then ran the Navy Department during the Spanish-American War of 1898. He became Governor of New York. Roosevelt became President after McKinley was assassinated. Roosevelt called his domestic policies a "Square Deal", promising a fair deal to the average citizen while breaking up large corporations.

He greatly expanded the system of national parks and national forests. He was responsible for building the Panama Canal. He negotiated an end to the Russo-Japanese War, for which he won the Nobel Peace Prize.

From 1914 to 1917 he campaigned for American entry into World War I. He is on Mount Rushmore together with George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, and Abraham Lincoln.
