
THOMAS JEFERSON



THOMAS JEFFERSON

Thomas Jefferson (born April 13, 1743 in Virginia) was an American Founding Father, the man who wrote much of the Declaration of Independence (1776), and the third President of the United States (1801–1809).

He was a fierce republican, along with his friend, John Adams. He represented Virginia in the Continental Congress at the start of the Revolutionary War, and in 1785 he served as a diplomat in Paris. Jefferson and James Madison founded the Democratic-Republican Party. He later fell out with George Washington and John Adams.

When he was elected president he called the event 'the Revolution of 1800". He was strongly in favor of expanding the new United States to cover all of North America and he bought the Louisiana Territory from France in 1803. It was he who began the removal of American Indians against their will, sending them to the then unwanted Louisiana Territory west of the Mississippi River, and so allowing European settlers to take over their lands.

In this belief of 'Manifest Destiny', he sent out Lewis and Clark (1804–1806) to find a way west so that America could stretch from 'sea to shining sea'. Jefferson doubled the size of the United States. He was less successful in his second term in dealing with foreign relations.

Even though he forced the removal of American Indians, he was opposed to slavery in principle, although he actually owned hundreds of slaves and did not make them free. In 1807 Jefferson signed into law a bill that banned slave importation into the United States.

After his presidency he is famous for designing his own large mansion in Virginia, called Monticello. Jefferson died in Charlottesville, Virginia, on July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of American independence.
