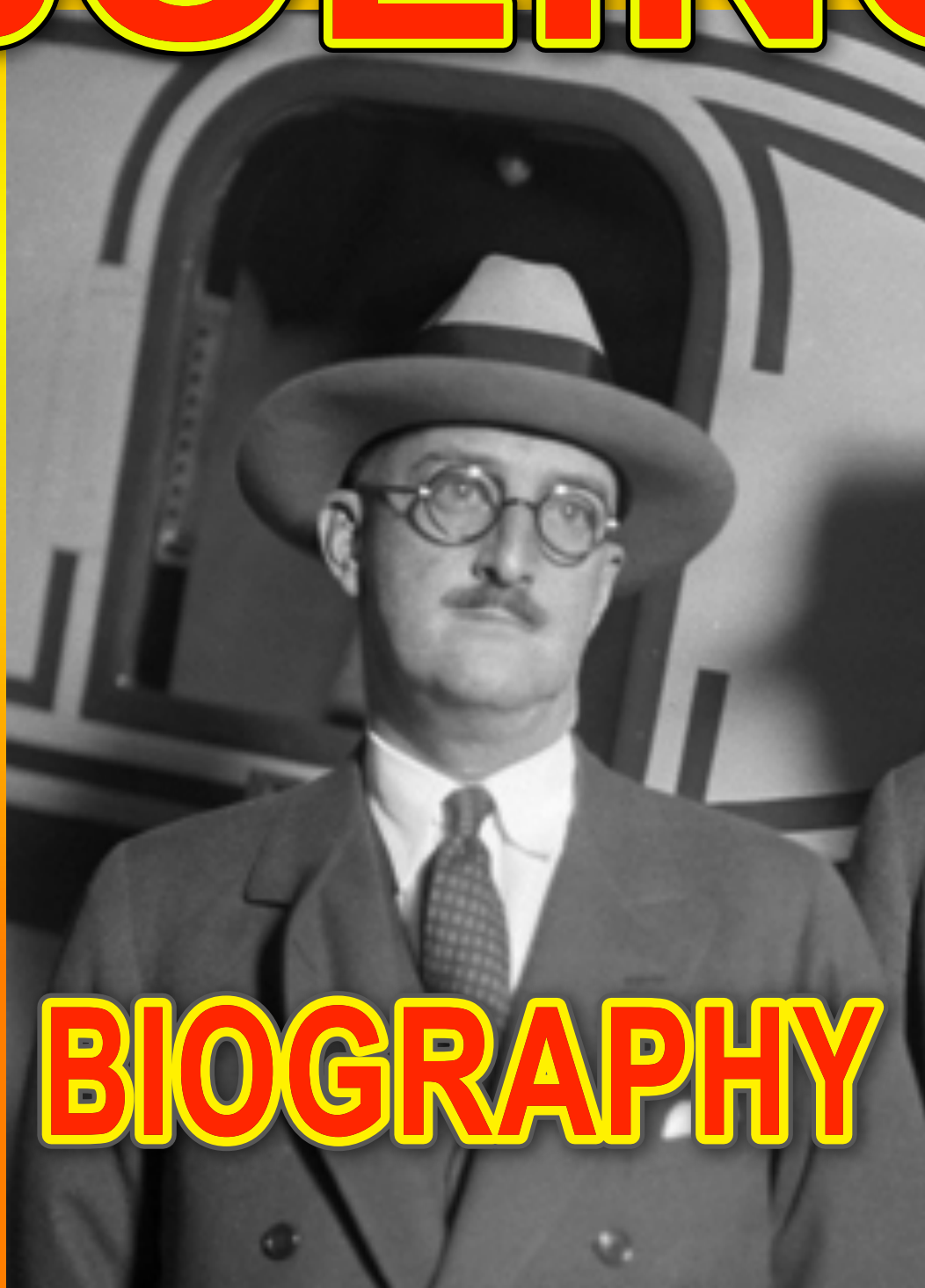

WILLIAM BOEING

William Boeing was born on October 1, 1881, in Detroit, Michigan. His first business interest was in timber, and he became president of the Greenwood Timber Company. He worked in the Northwest of America, in Washington and Alaska.

It was in Seattle in the early 1900s that Boeing saw airplanes for the first time, and fell in love with aviation. Before long he had bought his own plane, and took flying lessons. One time, Boeing's plane needed repairs, but the parts took months to be made. He thought he could make a better plane, and make it faster.

And so Boeing set up a factory on the Duwamish River near Seattle, and started designing and making planes. He started out making seaplanes – light airplanes that could land on water. These first planes were a success.

During World War I, Boeing started to get orders for warplanes from the U.S Navy. It was around this time that Boeing called his company Boeing Airplane Company. Although he then distanced himself from the company financially, William Boeing still advised workers there. During World War II, the Boeing Company made bombers. These proved vital to American success in the war.

Later on, Boeing's company moved into making commercial airplanes. These were used to carry airmail at first. Then Boeing developed the Boeing 707 passenger plane to carry people. It was the forerunner of the Boeing jets used by many airlines today. In 1934, William Boeing was awarded the Daniel Guggenheim Medal for his contributions to the aviation industry. He died on September 28, 1956.
